# Student Composition 2024-2025

During the 2024-2025 academic year, the total number of students was 233.

Greek students amounted to 68 (29%) while foreign students were 165 (71%).

# Comparative Analysis and Conclusions

- The data analysis reveals a significant increase in the percentage of foreign students from 2014-2015 to 2024-2025. The first grade shows the most significant increase, with the percentage of foreign students reaching 77% in 2024-2025.
- The decline in Greek students is particularly notable, highlighting the need for adjustments in teaching practices.

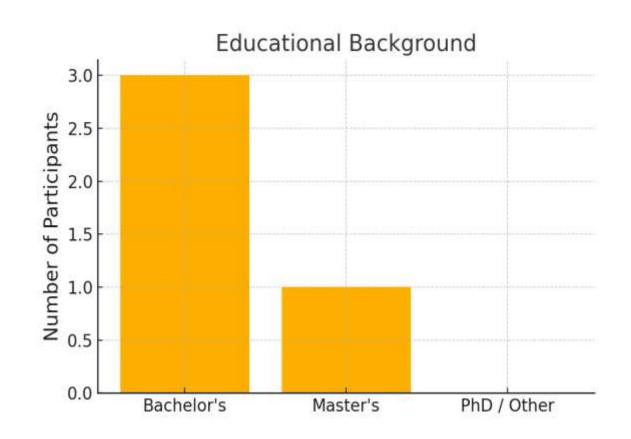

This is a highly experienced teaching staff, with over 21 years of service in public education.

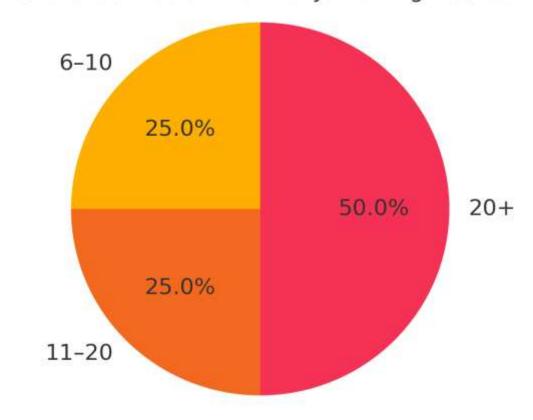
Nevertheless, only one out of the four has pursued postgraduate studies, and there are no holders of a doctoral degree or any other alternative academic background.

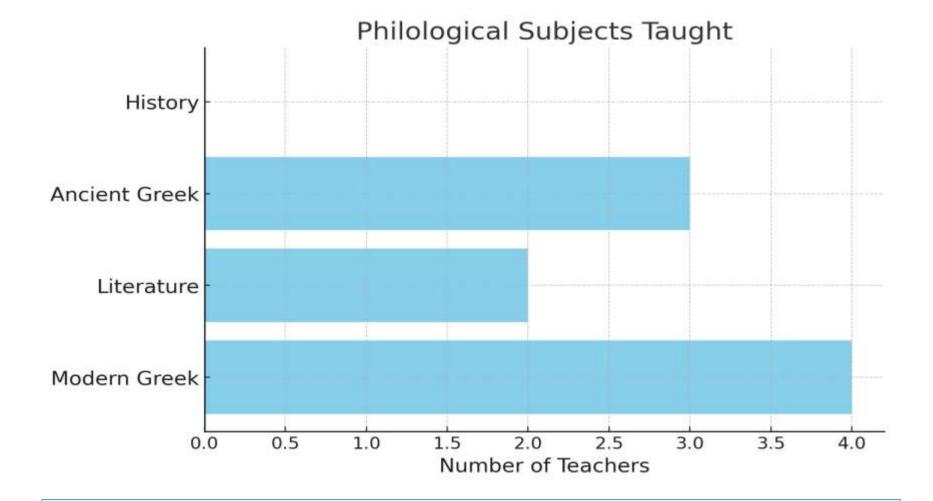


# Years of service at the 21<sup>st</sup> Junior High School of Athens

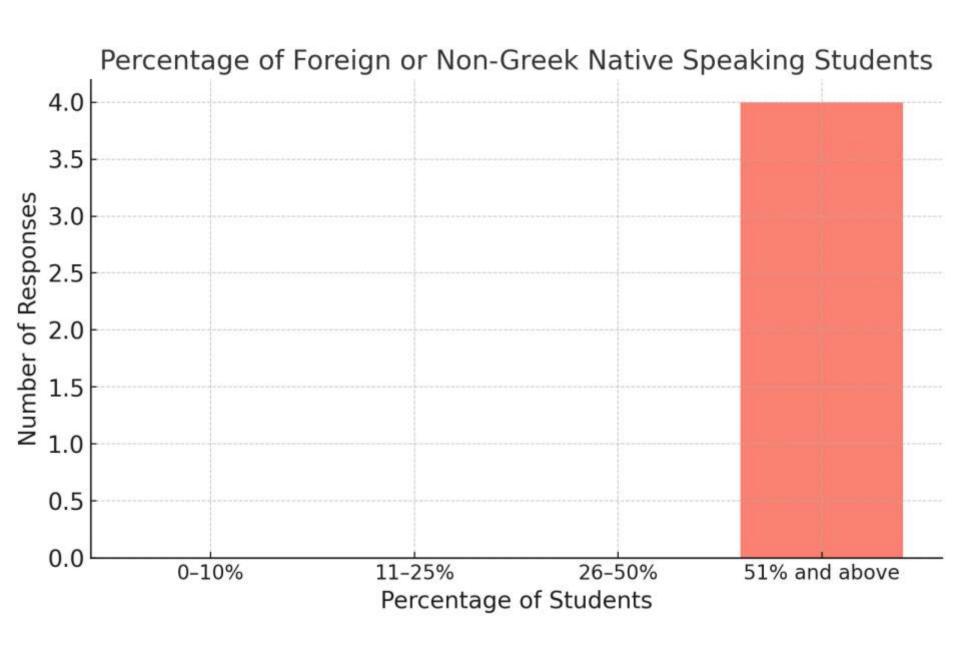
50% have been working at the school for over 20 years, which makes them highly knowledgeable about the changes that have taken place at the school over the years.

All teachers teach Modern Greek, which is a basic philological subject.

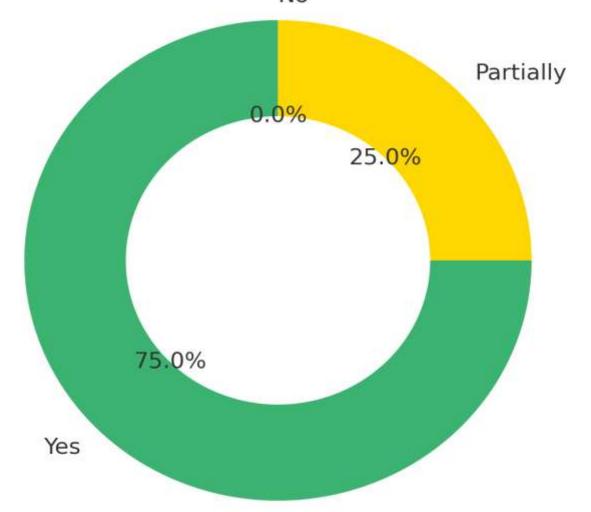


### **Classroom Student Demographics**

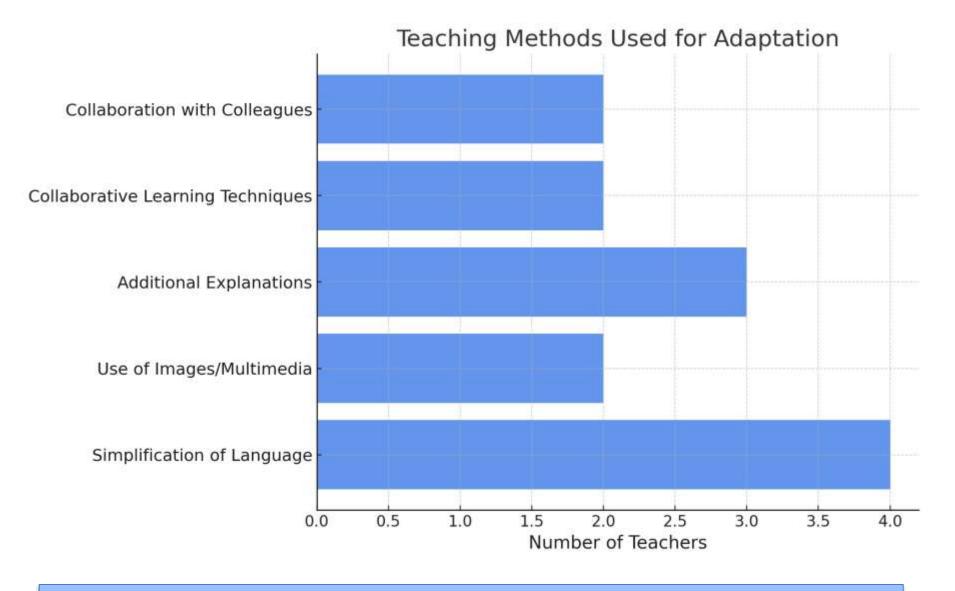
As shown in the previous chart, all participating teachers stated that more than 51% of the students in their classes are either foreign nationals or have a native language other than Greek.

Additionally, according to their responses in the questionnaire, they observe an increase in the presence of foreign and refugee students in the school population compared to the past.

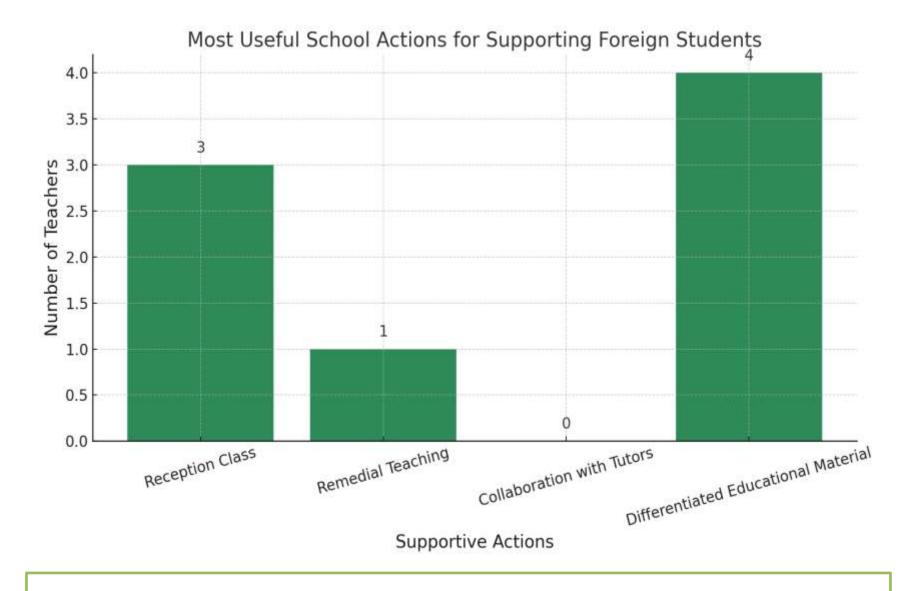

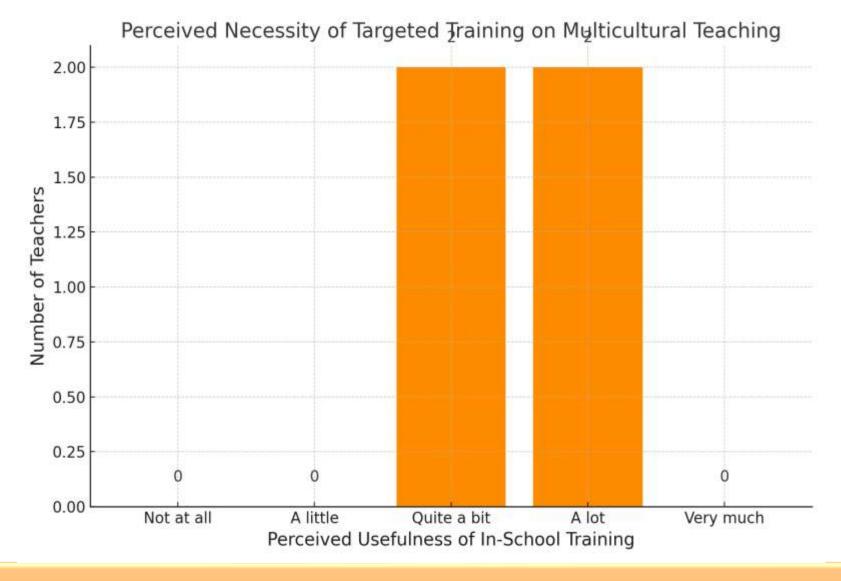
